



David Poythress on Georgia's Water Crisis: Video Transcript

POYTHRESS:

The Governor's race is about one thing ... the future.

And Georgians want to know how we're going to get back on track.

I think we'll get there by solving problems.

On water, we need options not more lawsuits. The courts have told us what we should have known all along – we can't simply ignore our neighbors – so we need real solutions on this issue right now. Simply put, we have a certifiable crisis that demands immediate action.

That's why Poythress will work with all parties to expand capacity of existing reservoirs. Build more reservoirs. And will immediately engage in regional diplomacy, working with border state Governors to establish equitable water usage agreements.

To promote water conservation, Poythress will give tax credits to families and small businesses that utilize low flow fixtures and water efficient landscapes. And he'll sign an Executive Order making Georgia government buildings a national model for sensible water conservation and green energy practices.
